Poster Presentations

We encourage each of you bring a poster regarding innovations in your training programs. These posters will be displayed at various times throughout the meeting, and will be used to foster conversation among participants. We ask the posters to, in some form, address the following:

- Motivation (i.e. what problem you sought to address)
- Approach (i.e. how you addressed the problem)
- Outcomes (i.e. what happened, and how have you assessed the effectiveness of your approach)
- Lessons learned (i.e. what have you learned, both positively and negatively that can be useful to others trying to do similar work)

We also encourage presenters to focus on issues of sustainability of and dissemination of your educational and training activities. PIs of T32 supplements funded through the following funding opportunity announcements ([PA-15-136](#); [PA-16-133](#); [PA-16-142](#); [PA-16-060](#); [PA-18-756](#); [PA-18-757](#)) are expected to present posters.

Poster Presentation General Information

- Presenters will be assigned locations to display their posters, which will be organized by TWD programs (MARC, IMSD, RISE, PREP, T32 Supplements, etc.)
- Poster boards and pushpins will be supplied, and posters should be attached to the boards for display.
- Presenters are encouraged to bring 1-page handouts to accompany their posters.
- Poster presentation abstracts are limited to 300 words.
- The poster-board surface area is 3'8" high and 5'6" wide.
- Each poster board will be marked with a unique poster board number. This unique number indicates the placement of the board within the Grand Ballroom Foyer at the Bethesda North Marriott Hotel & Conference Center.
